



<u>349/2020</u> **RESOLVED** that the Minutes of the Closed and Confidential Section of the Ordinary Meeting of Council held on 26 November 2020, copies of which have been circulated to Councillors be taken as read and confirmed. (Ryan/Boag)

<u>350/2020</u> RESOLVED that Council accepts the tender from, WDI Earthmoving, for the supply and delivery of 17,000 tonnes of DGB20 at a rate of \$33.00/tonne. (Neill/Boag)

### **351/2020 RESOLVED** that:

- 1. Council not accept any of the tenders submitted for the construction of the Bogan Shire Youth and Community Centre.
- 2. The General Manager enter into negotiations with any or all tenderers, as well as any other suitable person, with a view to entering into a contract in relation to the construction of the Bogan Shire Youth and Community Centre.
- 3. Council's reason for declining to invite fresh tenders is that:
  - a. This is the second time that tenders have been called for the Bogan Shire Youth and Community Centre with the resulting contract price being unaffordable on both occasions. The second tender was carried out with minimum requirements included.
  - Retendering is likely to lead to diminishing returns with increased costs in redesign and tendering.
  - c. The construction is tied to grant funding which is time sensitive.
- 4. Council's reason for determining to enter into negotiations is that:
  - a. Advice from Council's consultant is that a more positive result can be obtained by negotiating with contractors involving analysis and prioritisation of needs.
  - b. This negotiation process will result in a better financial outcome for Council in the best interests of our community.
- Council requests the New South Wales Government to reallocate funding of \$160,000 within the current round of Resources for Regions grants to the Bogan Shire Youth and Community Centre from the CBD Tourism Developments project.



- Council provides \$200,000 in own funding from the sale of the 8A and 8B Dandaloo Street properties subject to notification of a successful outcome of current Resources For Regions funding applications.
- 7. Council considers including the \$160,000 taken from the CBD Tourism Development project in future rounds of grant funding.

### 2 PANGEE STREET FIG TREE

### Summary:-

The purpose of this report is to present Council with two options for the management of the Fig Tree on the Pangee Street footpath (in front of the Davidson Park toilets).

## 357/2020 RESOLVED that:

- 1. Council introduce measures to monitor the tree's health and stability for a period of time including:
  - Closing off parking spaces in the tree's fall zone for a period to be determined based on arborist's advice
  - ii. Installing motion sensors on the tree and having these monitored on an ongoing basis by an arborist as required
  - iii. Bracing the tree
  - iv. Watering the tree
- 2. Council provides the required budget adjustment, (being \$6,000), to undertake these actions at the second budget review.
- 3. Council's procedures on excavations, eg: Risk Assessments JSA, to include, that if the area contains trees of significance that all possible avenues are explored to prevent damage to the trees major root systems, eg: engineering a possible change or location of the required service around the tree.

- Council does not accept the RMS decision on the speed limit in Hermidale and refers this back to the RMS. (Jackson/Deacon)


